CSP066/20/21 – PUBLIC FORUM

There was one member of the public present, who wished to raise the following points:

- The fencing on the Church Path where ongoing problems had occurred with someone fouling in the area, had broken in parts.
- Speeding through the village with the danger increasing following a car being clipped by another.

CSP067/20/21 – TO RECEIVE APOLOGIES OF ABSENCE

None had been received.

CSP068/20/21 – TO RECEIVE DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

CSP069/20/21 – TO RECEIVE APPLICATIONS FOR DISPENSATION

CSP070/20/21 – TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD ON 18TH JANUARY 2021 AND 15TH FEBRUARY 2021

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the meetings held on 18th January 2021 and 15th February 2021 be approved as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

CSP071/20/21 – POLICE REPORT

The Police were not present at the meeting and a report had not been received.

CSP072/20/21 - TO RECEIVE THE COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT – CLLR GREEN

Cllr Green was not present at the meeting and a report had not been received.

CSP071/20/21 – TO RECEIVE THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORTS – CLLR NORRIS

Cllr Norris's report was circulated prior to the meeting which contained the following matters:

- An update on Covid-19 in Suffolk
- Additional Restrictions Grant reopened for businesses in Mid Suffolk
- New Year, New Homes
- Stowmarket Arts Centre got major boost
- New service to support residents to live independently and safely in their homes
- Pledge to tackle anti-semitism
- Census 2021 would provide a snapshot of modern society
- New recycling campaign aimed to get Suffolk's recycling right

The report would be published on the village website.

Cllr Norris had nothing further to add but confirmed that he had taken the Poundfield application up with enforcement and would follow it up.

CSP072/20/21 – TALK FROM MSDC – SECTION 106 COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY

Roy Emmerson, Communities Officer – Grants and Funding, and his colleague Richard Kendrew explained what Section 106 (S.106) and Community Infrastructure Levy (CiL) was and how it could be used should the Parish Council be given any such funding. They reported what the money could be used for and how various pots of money could also be applied for.

Their understanding was that in relation to the Gateway 14 development the Parish Council would not be receiving any CiL monies but may benefit from S.106 money.

Mr Emmerson also explained that Community Grant Funding could be available for the Parish Council which could be used for projects such as play areas. A maximum of £25,000 could be applied for.

CSP073/20/21 - TO RECEIVE THE CLERK'S REPORT AND FINANCIAL MATTERS

a) TO RECEIVE THE CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk reported that she had received the Grass Cutting contract from Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC) for the cost of £143.22 + VAT.

Cllr Mason felt that the grass needed to be cut more regularly to stop the long cuttings that were usually left making the ground more uneven.

It was AGREED: That the contract be renewed.

b) FINANCIAL REPORT

The Clerk reported on the Council's current financial position and movements since the last meeting. It was reported that the balance in the accounts on 9th March 2021 was £19,672.56.

It was AGREED: That Trevor Brown CPFA (Local Council Financial Services & Internal Audit) be appointed as auditor for the purposes of the 2020/21 audit.

It was AGREED: That the same arrangements applied for external audit arrangements as last year, that the Parish Council did not need an external audit and therefore be classed as exempt.

CSP074/20/21 – POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

It was AGREED: That the Internal Audit Control and Risk Management Arrangements were reviewed and adopted.

CSP075/20/21 – PLANNING APPLICATIONS

DC/21/01357 - Householder Planning Application - Erection of front porch extension (following demolition of existing); Application of external thermal render to front elevation and gable end - 4 Peterhouse, Pound Road, Creeping St Peter

It was AGREED: That the Parish Council had no objections to the application. **Clerk to action.**

CSP076/20/21 - PLANNING DECISIONS

CSP077/20/21 – CONTRIBUTION TO GATEWAY 14

The Gateway 14 Resident Campaign Group had approached the Parish Council to ask if any contribution could be made towards the cost to appoint a Planning Consultant.

Cllr Valladares felt, and members agreed, that whilst the work of the Campaign Group was very much appreciated, and the Parish Council were sympathetic to the costs involved in making such an appointment, it was not something the parish Council could get involved with and wouldn't be able to justify the amount. The Parish Council's involvement was that of the planning side of Gateway 14.

CSP078/20/21 – OFFER OF FUNDING FROM AN OUTSIDE BODY

At a recent meeting of the Parish Council Michael Roddy, Chief Executive of the Poundfield site, had offered a contribution of funds to the sum of £7,000, to the Parish Council to use as they wished. The Parish Council felt that the money would be better suited to a project such as refurbishing the Church Hall for example. Cllr Valladares had spoken with the Parochial Church Council (PCC) who confirmed they would be happy to make a bid for the money, if the Parish Council formally wrote to them to inform them of the money offered.

It was AGREED: That the Clerk write to the PCC informing them of the money available.

CSP079/20/21 - PLAY AREA

The Clerk reminded members that regular checks of the play area needed to be carried out. Cllr Mason informed the Clerk that he had carried out the last check approximately one month ago. The Clerk asked for the paperwork so she could keep it on file for insurance purposes.

CSP080/20/21 – FEN ALDER CARR NATURE RESERVE

There was nothing to report.

CSP081/20/21 – MATTERS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

- Potholes – Mill Lane / Pound Road – concerns following the approaching 9 week closure for drainage works – defects in roads going to be missed.
- Speeding traffic through the village.
- Suffolk Association of Local Councils (SALC) had approved the revised Code of Conduct which would soon be circulated.
